



Community Radio International Networks

AMARC is an abbreviation for the World Association of community radio broadcasters.

Established in 1983, it is an international non-governmental organisation (INGO) with a worldwide membership of over 30,000 people. It is governed by an international board and its operations are managed by an international secretariat.

The AMARC charter was adopted on 18th of September 1994 in Ljubljana, Slovenia at the first AMARC Pan-European Conference of Community Radio Broadcasters. Further details on AMARC are available from the website: <http://www.amarceurope.eu> or <http://amarc.org/>

One of the main activities of AMARC is to organise network opportunities for its members to learn from each other. Organised conferences are hosted in different countries on a regular basis.
